Our family run guest house is a 17th century listed building situated adjacent to Laxton Heritage Museum. The roof was updated to clay tiles in 1748. Inside the oak beams, doors and pantry remain as they were up to 400 years ago. Lilac Farm combines the beauty of a traditional beamed farm cottage with modern facilities.

Location

Set in the historic village of Laxton where strip farming is still practiced, Lilac Farm is only 5 miles from the A1. It offers easy access to open countryside including a network of footpaths through the Open Fields and to the motte & bailey castle.

Lilac Farm is near Sherwood Forest - Robin Hood Country, close to the Nottinghamshire / Lincolnshire border and is convenient for Southwell Minster and Lincoln Cathedral as well as the market towns of Retford and Newark on Trent. Newark Showground and nearby Swinderby are an antique collector's paradise, staging world famous Antiques Fairs several times a year.

Eating Out

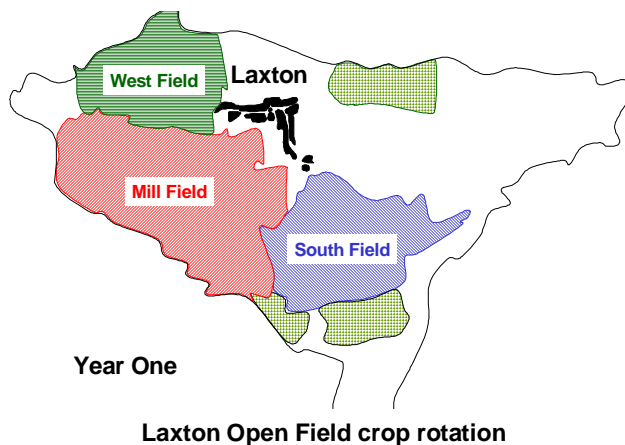
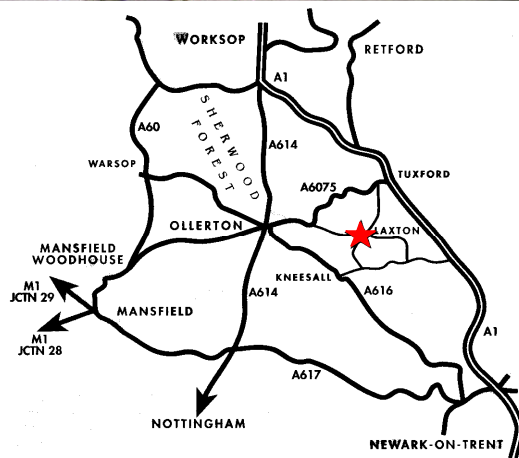
The area is renowned for its excellent pub food. 'The Dovecote' is only 5 minutes walk away. There are good quality restaurants within easy reach catering for all tastes.

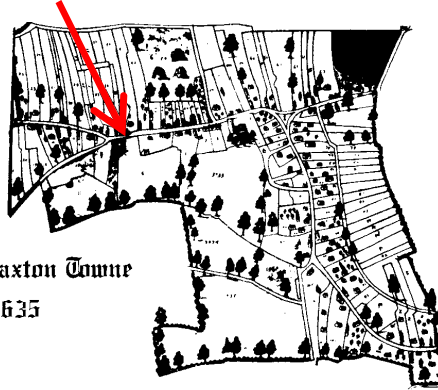

Directions

From the A1 North

When you reach Markham Moor, a large island with several services, including McDonalds, take the Tuxford / Ollerton exit.

In the centre of Tuxford village, at the top of the rise, is a crossroads with the Newcastle public house on your right. Turn right here, then *immediately* right again, signed to Egmanton, between the Newcastle and the Sun public houses.

Follow this road for about 2.5 miles, round several sharp bends through Egmanton and up a hill to Laxton. As you enter Laxton, bear right at a Y junction, then continue to the right at the end of a grassy island with a large central tree. Pass the church on your left. Lilac Farm is on your right a few doors past the village shop.

From the A1 South

Travel north about 5 miles beyond Newark, taking the turning to Carlton-on-Trent just after an 'OK' Diner.

At the end of the slip road, turn left over the railway crossing. Travel about 3 miles through the village of Ossington to a crossroads where Laxton is signed to the right. Turn right following the road into Laxton, bearing left as you enter the village. Continue on the main road past The Dovecote public house on your right. Pass the church on your left. Lilac Farm is on your right a few doors past the village shop.
